Preserving Pennsylvania's African American Historic Cemeteries

We are the leading voice for historic African American burial grounds and cemeteries in Pennsylvania and those that have interred American Civil War soldiers and sailors. As volunteers we inform the public through our website, Facebook page, YouTube channel, links to other resources, events, as presenters, workshops, our Cemetery Stewards Roundtable discussions and annual meetings & conferences.

MISSION:

The mission of the Pennsylvania Hallowed Grounds (PAHG) is to honor, interpret, and preserve African American cemeteries and the burial sites of Civil War African American Sailors and United States Colored Troops in Pennsylvania. PAHG connects and builds the capacity of stewards of these cemeteries and burial sites, and supports conservation, documentation, education, and training. Working collaboratively with other groups and organizations, PAHG provides tangible encounters with memory and enriches the public understanding of history.

HISTORY:

In 2013, two visionary leaders sparked a movement. The first, Lenwood Sloan, was hired by the state tourism office to help commemorate Pennsylvania's role in the 150th anniversary of the Civil War. The second was Barbara Barksdale, who had led an over 20-year effort to save and restore the Midland Cemetery outside of Steelton, Pa., in Dauphin County. Twelve years ago, a small conference was held to announce the formation of Pennsylvania Hallowed Grounds. The gathering included caretakers of African American cemeteries from around the Commonwealth. Attendees shared their experiences and challenges, and in doing so, discovered they had much in common. The organization began with a focus on the protection of the burial sites of United States Colored Troops from the Civil War. It expanded to include the Civil War African American Sailors and the preservation, documentation, and interpretation of African American cemeteries.

WHAT WE OFFER:

We have collected links to resources that will help you to better understand the threats facing African American cemeteries in Pennsylvania and around the nation, and the work of Pennsylvania Hallowed Grounds to preserve our African American burial grounds.

PAHG partnered with the Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to create the Multiple Property Documentation Form (MPDF), African American Cemeteries and Churches in Pennsylvania, c.1644 – 1970, which was approved by the National Park Service in 2021. It provides an overview of Pennsylvania's African American history, and the important role that historic churches and cemeteries play in telling that story. By approving this document, the National Park Service recognized that African American churches and cemeteries are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.
